

2017 UTAH LONG RANGE AND FULLBORE MATCHES

MATCH DATE: Saturday: March 25, 2017; April 22, 2017, May 27, 2017, September 23, 2017, October 28, 2017, & November 4, 2017, all weather permitting. **It is imperative that you notify the match director that you intend to participate and supply a phone number and e-mail address so you can be notified of weather or other changes. Also check the USRPA web site before you leave home to make sure the match is still on (see home page for alert notices, <http://usrpa.org>).**

DIRECTIONS TO RANGE: Wendover, Utah 84083, take I-80 Exit #1 (last exit in Utah). Come downhill on 2nd East to near the airport tower. Go west on Airport Way ½ mile. Gate 70 is located at N40.72949 W114.04745, pass this gate and drive to the target pit area for squadding.

TIME: Firing will commence following squadding assignments at 0900. The gate will be accessible at 0800. The gate combination will be 0000 on the lock labelled USRPA.

FACILITIES: Wendover, Utah and West Wendover, Nevada are the nearest cities with motels, restaurants, gambling, etc.

NOTE: Competitors should bring their own food and water. A porta-a-pottie will be located in the target pit.

RULES: Current NRA HIGH POWER Rifle Rules will govern.

ELIGIBILITY: This is an Approved Match open to any individual who is a member of the Utah State Rifle and Pistol Association or their respective State Associations. A \$5.00 nonmember fee for this match will be charged for those without proof of current Utah State Rifle & Pistol Association membership or in their respective State Associations. USRPA membership is \$25 per year. Applications will be available at the range (\$10.00 for Juniors per year).

CLASSIFICATION: Competitors holding an NRA High Power Rifle Long Range & F-Class classification will shoot in their respective classes. All unclassified shooters will shoot in the Master class (Rule 19.2). Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2) may be used in making entry in this match. Competitors should be prepared to present their NRA classification card before squadding (Rule 19.7).

REGISTRATION LIMITED: Entries will be limited to the first 30 competitors to register. Registration cards are available online at <http://usrpa.org/Highpower/SR-1Form.pdf>. All pre-registrations must be received by the Wednesday before the match. Late registrations will be accepted at the range prior to the squadding at 0830, up to range capacity.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES: Competitors desiring to shoot in this match need to contact Larry Scanlan to let him know their intent no later than the Wednesday, 5:00 p.m., prior to the match. If on that Wednesday, there are insufficient shooters preregistered (6 or less), the match will be canceled and prepaid fees returned. If canceled, those preregistered shooters will be notified. Any cancellation will also be posted on <http://usrpa.org/>.

FEES: Total entry fees are as follows: Fee for Adults: \$30.00. (\$25.00 if received on or before Wednesday before the match). Fee for Juniors: (Through the year they turn 20) \$ 20.00. (\$15.00 if received on or before Wednesday before the match).

Challenge fee is \$2.00

OPEN BOLT INDICATOR: The use of an open bolt indicator is mandatory (Rule 3.21). They are available for \$1.00 from the match director.

RIFLE CATAGORIES: All with No Muzzle brakes, and .35 caliber or less. Any Rifle / Any Sight Class, F-Class Open, and F-TR Class.

TARGET PULLERS: No target pullers will be provided. Each competitor will pull targets unless a suitable substitute is approved by the Match Director. Those competitors who fail to perform their pit duties will be disqualified.

SIGHTING SHOTS: Unlimited sighting shots will be allowed only for the first fired match as indicated in the time periods designated below. Sighting shots which are allowed for each match must be taken and scored. Sighting shots in Fullbore matches may be converted for score in consecutive, reverse order in which they were fired, at the discretion of the shooter.

SCORING: Competitors will score for each other. Those competitors who fail to perform their scoring duties may be disqualified.

Saturday – Long Range:

MATCH 1: 1,000 yards-Slow Fire Prone. Unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record in 30 Minutes. Coaching is allowed for sighting shots).

MATCH 2: 1,000 yards-Slow Fire Prone. 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record in 22 Minutes. No coaching allowed.

MATCH 3: 1 000 yards- low Fire Prone. 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record in 22 Minute. No coaching allowed.

Note: the relay will be considered complete when all shooters have fired 20 shots for record, even if time remains. If a majority of shooters want to shoot a Palma course, the Course of Fire will be 800, 900, and 1000 yards.

Sunday - Fullbore: (If there is sufficient interest by 6 or more shooters)

MATCH 1: 300 yards-Slow Fire Prone fired on MR-63 target.

MATCH 2: 600 yards-Slow Fire Prone fired on MR-65 target.

MATCH 3: 1000 yards-Slow Fire Prone fired on LR or LR-F target.

AWARDS: There must be 5 or more entries in a shooter classification for an award. If there are not enough entries for class awards, an award will only be given out to the match winner. Competitors may be combined with the next higher class when there are less than 5 competitors per class. If there are fewer than 5 High-Masters entered, they will fire for overall awards only. The class will not be combined with the High-Master class.

MODIFICATIONS: The Match Director reserves the right to make modifications while staying within the NRA rules according to this match program.
